Our Courses







English For Every Purpose

IH Brisbane - ALS is an English Language College, registered to offer programs to international students.

The College provides English Language Intensive Courses for overseas students (ELICOS) to students from many countries. We teach English over six levels from Beginner to Advanced using the most up-to-date teaching methods and equipment. Audiovisual materials from Australia are combined with materials from England, the United States and Canada to give the student a well-rounded knowledge of accents and idioms in all parts of the English speaking world.

Classes are taught by qualified and experienced teachers. The College specialises in preparing students for the IELTS test and for Vocational and University studies in Australia.

IH Brisbane - ALS Courses

A. General English Full Time. CRICOS No. 062145C

General English is taught over six levels:

1. Beginner 2. Elementary 3. Pre-Intermediate 4. Intermediate 5. Upper Intermediate 6. Advanced

IH Brisbane – ALS offers students the chance to study up to 29 hours per week; 20 hours of Core and Skill classes (the minimum you must attend) and 9 more optional hours.

Core Class and Skills Class (20 hours) - Monday to Thursday

From Monday to Thursday, students take their core class and communication skills classes. Attendance in these classes counts towards the attainment of the IH Brisbane – ALS Certificate and the requirements of student visas.

Speak More Class / Homework room (4 hours)

From Mondays to Thursdays students have the option of taking an hour-long conversation class with teachers focused on a particular topic or grammar function.

Friday Elective Class (5 hours)

On Friday mornings, students have the option to focus on (amongst other things) Writing, Task-based Communication, PET or FCE preparation, Test feedback classes or to have IELTS exam practice. Every 3 weeks there is a "Level Up" test which is a test of all macro skills plus grammar and vocabulary. A student who passes the test may move up to the next level. These tests are optional.

On Friday afternoons, students can choose from 2 hour "Clubs" where teachers focus on (amongst other things) Pronunciation, Job Search Skills, Business English Skills, IELTS writing skills or reading or listening in the Book Club or TV Club. Alternatively students have the option of spending those 2 hours taking a cooking class, going on an excursion or playing sport. All of these classes and sessions have a qualified teacher.

B. General English Part Time - 15 hours per week (Mornings only).

This course is available to Australian Residents and students with Visitor Visas, or Working Holiday Visas only. Part-time courses are not available to students who have an Australian Student Visa. You don't need academic qualifications or previous English experience to join this course.

C. IELTS Exam Preparation Full Time. CRICOS No. 062147A

IELTS Exam is taught in three levels: 1- Intermediate 2- Upper-Intermediate 3- Advanced

This is a full-time, 20 hour per week course designed to prepare students for the IELTS Exam. Students learn the vocabulary and language skills required as well as examination techniques specific to the IELTS Exam.

On Fridays, there are full reading and listening tests in the morning and writing tests in the afternoon. Once every six weeks, students also have a full speaking test to check their progress. There are 3 levels of IELTS Preparation, Intermediate (B1), Upper-Intermediate (B2) and Advanced (C1). Students are also able to study for an additional 9 hours outside these 20.

D. English for Academic Purposes – EAP Full Time. CRICOS No. 062146B

This is a full-time, 25 hour per week course designed to prepare students for university or further studies in Australia.

Students get practice in all language skills, grammar functions and academic vocabulary while also listening to lectures, giving presentations and producing reports. The importance of referencing, correct paraphrasing and the avoidance of plagiarism are also taught. Students are able to study in this course for either 6 or 12 weeks. The entry level is Upper-Intermediate (B2).

E. Cambridge First Certificate of English Exam Preparation – FCE (Full time 10-12 weeks). CRICOS No. 062149K

The FCE course begins in January, March, June and September. Students learn the vocabulary, reading, writing, listening and speaking skills as well as the correct use of English required to pass the FCE test.

This course also includes test taking techniques and an intensive study format with plenty of homework.

Only serious students, with an Upper-Intermediate (B2) level of English, who intend to sit for the actual FCE test will be accepted.

F. Cambridge Certificate of Advanced English Exam Preparation – CAE (Full time 12 weeks). CRICOS No. 062148M

The CAE course begins in March and September. Students learn extended versions of the vocabulary, reading, writing, listening and speaking skills as well as the correct use of English required to pass the CAE test.

This course also includes test taking techniques and an intensive study format with plenty of homework.

Only serious students, with an Advanced (C1) level of English, who intend to sit for the actual CAE test will be accepted.

G. Business English Intermediate Full Time. CRICOS No. 076650D

This is a full-time, 20 hour per week course designed to for those who need to learn English for use in a business context. Students learn English through a range of business orientated topics, such as: Leadership, Strategy, Pay, Development, Marketing, Outsourcing and Financing.

Business English will help you get ahead in the workplace; learn it now and get a jump start on your career.

It is designed for students with a minimum Intermediate (B1) level of English.

H. Certificate IV in Tesol. CRICOS No. 073981J

The Certificate IV in TESOL is a government-accredited course (RTO No. 32044) that is designed for those who want to get into the field of language teaching. Use your qualification to become a private tutor or start your own company providing tuition to international students, or go on to teach abroad or in Australia.

I. Private Tuition – From a qualified English teacher

You can also get one-to-one tuition from a teacher. These sessions are flexible. Ask us for more information.

J. Certificate II in Spoken and Written English. CRICOS No. 077232C



K. Certificate III in Spoken & Written English. CRICOS No. 071132M





Use your qualification to become a private tutor or start your own company providing tuition to international students, or go on to teach abroad or in Australia.

How is the course run?

It's an 8 week intensive course. You'll study for an average of 27.5 hours a week face to face, with additional time needed for homework, lesson planning and written assignments.

What will I learn from this TESOL Course?

It places a high value on getting you ready for the real classroom, packed with practical ideas and a practical teaching component.

On the course you'll learn all the skills needed to be an effective and competent teacher of English. This TESOL course will give you the theory, techniques and ideas to plan great lessons and keep your classes on track.

You'll learn how to get on with students, and keep their attention and interest and become confident as a teacher.

On the course you'll cover (amongst other things)...

Homestay... Living with an Australian Family



IH Brisbane - ALS can place you with a friendly Australian Homestay family who have been selected by our Homestay Service to suit your requirements. We can also provide a car and driver to meet you at the airport and take you to your Homestay. All of our Homestay families have a genuine interest in international students and know how to make students feel welcome. "Full Board Homestay" means that you get breakfast and an evening meal on weekdays and three meals a day on weekends. Students have their own room and clean bed linen, pillows and blankets are provided.

Each room has a wardrobe, study desk and chair. Homestay in Brisbane is more reasonably priced than some other Australian cities and the standard of accommodation is excellent.

Our homestay families are experienced in the care of English language learners, so they are patient and caring. They will also help you with your English at home.

When you first apply for Homestay you will be asked to complete Homestay Questionnaire, (see our Application Form), so that we can find the Homestay home and family that best suits you. Homestay Arrangement Charge: There is a charge for arranging homestay. This is shown on our Application Form and in the Prices section of our website. If you require Homestay, you will need to pay this charge at the time of enrolment.

If you require airport greeting, you should also pay the airport greeting charge at the time of enrolment.

Please do not pay Homestay weekly charges in advance. These should be paid directly to the homestay family on arrival.

You will need to pay a minimum of four(4) weeks homestay on arrival. Remember, staying with a caring Australian homestay family is the best way to improve your English and make lasting friends on your visit to Australia. You may make wonderful Australian friends whom you will know all your life.

Homestay Information

- An applicant must be 18 years or more.
- Homestay placement fee \$190 + Airport reception fee \$ 95.
 - Pay to IH Brisbane ALS prior to placement.
 - 10% surcharge (\$ 9.50) for airport reception service provided between 10pm-6am.
- Homestay fee \$ 220 ~ \$230 per week (2 meals on weekdays and 3 meals on weekend).
 - Pay 4 weeks homestay fee (\$ 880) in advance to host family upon arrival.

IH Brisbane - ALS Student Accommodation

IH Brisbane – ALS can place you in a share accommodation or a private room as well. This is a different option for students who do not want to stay with a homestay family. Students will be able to choose between a private room or twin share room (share the room with another student).

Luxury & Resort Style

This accommodation in Upper Mount Gravatt offers comfortable rooms and great amenities for a fair price. Positioned 15km from the city, travel time to the city is 20 to 25 minutes by bus.

Facilities include: En suite bath/toilet in each room, air conditioning, gym, swimming pool, tennis court, Internet (2 GB per month), spa and free laundry, kitchen wares.

Conditions: Student must pay four weeks upfront; \$200 Bond required; \$65 airport pick up (optional); accommodation placement fee \$65.*
